Born in Swansea, Huw Williams is Director of Music at Bath Abbey, where he directs its renowned professional choirs of boys, girls, and men. A conductor and award-winning organist of international standing, he served until recently as Director of Music at Her Majesty’s Chapel Royal, St James’ Palace, where his predecessors included Thomas Tallis, William Byrd, and Henry Purcell. While at the Chapel Royal he conducted the music for Prince George’s Christening, the Queen’s Christmas Message in 2015, the annual Remembrance Sunday Service at the Cenotaph, and numerous other events in the presence of Her Majesty the Queen and members of the Royal Family. A graduate of the Royal Academy of Music and former Organ Scholar of Christ’s College, Cambridge, his musical achievements led to him being awarded the Queen’s Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012. He is Music Director of Cantemus Chamber Choir, widely regarded as one of Wales’ finest choirs, and of Stroud Choral Society.

Last weekend a team from River Road made their way to Camp Alkulana, stopping at Mrs. Rowe's in Staunton for breakfast, of course, for the annual clean up day to help prepare for the upcoming season. The list of projects included upgrading the lighting in the big lodge, bathroom/showers, and walkways. This day trip is one of the many ways our church continues to support the important ministry that is Camp Alkulana.

The Friendship Sunday School Class members have been champions for Camp Alkulana over the years, and extend their enthusiasm to the congregation! The camp relies almost entirely on gifts from churches and individuals to fund its summer and year-round programs. ### *Circulo de Costura* Exhibit in the Lower Commons

In July 2017, the “Catch the Spirit” special committee of the Board of Missions shared a grant to assist the *Circulo de Costura*, or *Sewing Circle*, which started meeting at the CrossOver Healthcare Ministry. On October 30, 2017, nine women completed the first session. They had learned how to use a sewing machine and completed projects of progressive difficulty. However, more important than sewing skills were the relationships which formed within the group.

Since then, not only have the relationships grown, but so has the program, including more advanced sewing classes, quilting classes, and knitting classes.

The exhibit features the work of the women from all three classes. It features skirts, pot holders, table runners, quilts, and knitted pieces. The display remains up until June 10. Stop by the exhibit after the church reception on June 2 to meet the students and teachers.

## Hands & Hearts: Nickelsville Mission Trip

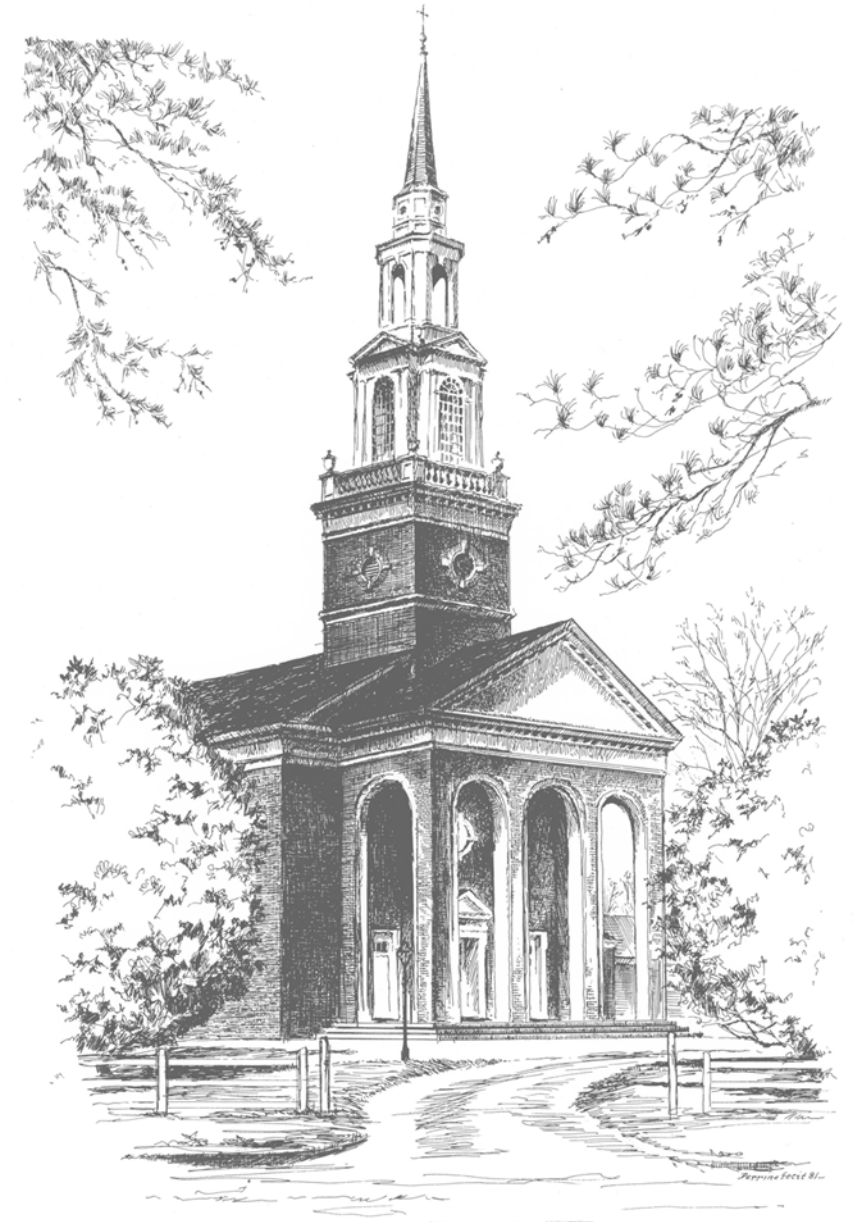
### June 23-28, 2019
