Each evening service will be followed by a brief fellowship time on the plaza with a cool ice cream treat.


Holland Lectures with Dr. C. Michael Hawn "Tell me what you sing and I'll tell you who you are: Developing a Congregational Identity through Congregational Singing" Sundays, August 4-September 1, 2019, 9:45 a.m., Fellowship Hall

C. Michael Hawn is one of our nation's leading experts in hymnology and world music. Now a Richmonder, he recently retired after 25 years from Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, as University Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Church Music and director of the Sacred Music Program. Previously he taught at two Baptist seminaries for a total of 15 years. We are excited to welcome Dr. Hawn back to RRCB for another series of lectures!

Congregational singing both forms our individual faith perspective, but also shapes us as the body of Christ in community. These lectures will examine our hymnic heritage that have shaped our faith, look at some trends that are currently influencing the ecumenical church, and consider the cultural, societal, and ethical issues that inspire what we might sing in the future.
