Due to rain in the forecast, this event has been moved to Wednesday, December 23!

On *Wednesday* there will be a drive-thru nativity at church. When you arrive, the parking lot will be marked for entrance and exit off of Ridge Road. You will have the opportunity to contribute canned goods for those in need, after which you can proceed through scenes from the Christmas story. While sign-ups are not mandatory, they are helpful when planning: *rrcb.org/nativity*. Ahead of *driving thru*, here are a few reminders:

- Please be sure to stay in your car for the duration of the drive-thru
- Please wear masks while in the car greeting ministers
- During the food drop off, please wear your mask, and hand the minister your offering through your car window
